CENTRAL CATHOLIC GRADUATES IN THE HALL OF FAME

K.C. COWGILL



K.C. Cowgill, a 2000 GICC graduate, was inducted into the Nebraska High School Hall of Fame in September 2022. The 2000 World-Herald Athlete of the Year earned

All-State honors in volleyball and basketball and put together an undefeated State Championship season on the tennis court. Threepoint shots were her specialty, thanks to shooting 500 per day in practice. She set state and school records from beyond the arc and finished her basketball career as the state's second-leading all-time scorer with 2,427 points. K.C. played college basketball at Nebraska before transferring to Southwest Missouri State, where she was the Missouri Valley Newcomer of the Year. She set school records for 3-pointers made and led the nation making 53%of her 3s. "It was a great experience competing at Central Catholic," Cowgill said. "There were so many great things I got to accomplish with my teammates over the years."

MIKE MCCLAREN



Mike McClaren, who graduated from GICC in 1983, was inducted into the Nebraska State Wrestling Coaches Association Hall of Fame

in 2023. His wife, Shandra, and his sons, Chase and Tanner, accepted the honor in Mike's name. McClaren was killed in an automobile accident during the summer of 2009. While competing at GICC, McClaren won two state titles. He captured the Class C 112 pounds, helping the Crusaders take the Class C state title in 1982. McClaren followed that up with another state title his senior year, winning the Class B 119-pound title. After his high school days, he went on to wrestle at Chadron State College. He was a four-year letter winner and captured the 1987 NAIA title at 126 pounds after finishing runner-up three times. "I wish he would be here because he would be ecstatic about getting this honor," Shandra said.

TYLER PETERSON



Tyler Peterson, who graduated from GICC in 1997, was inducted into the Nebraska Wesleyan Athletic Hall of Fame for his baseball career. Peterson

is one of the top two-way players in Nebraska Wesleyan history. Peterson's name is etched all over the record book while leading the program to new heights. In 29 career appearances, including three starts, he recorded a 5-2 record, a 2.99 ERA, and 12 saves. He posted 56 career strikeouts as a closer. Peterson ended his career with school records for home runs in a season, saves in a season, saves in a career, and E.R.A. in a season. He still holds the records for saves in a career and E.R.A. in a season. Over his four years, he racked up 117 runs, 150 hits, 32 doubles, 25 home runs, and 127 RBIs, while batting .393. Nebraska Wesleyan recorded 85 victories in Peterson's four seasons, and Peterson led the Prairie Wolves to one conference tournament championship, two conference regular season runnerup finishes, and a conference regular season championship.



JAMES LOWRY


The Hastings College Alumni Association named James Lowry as the Outstanding Alumni Coach award recipient this year. Lowry, a '91/'94 MAT, has been touted as one of the best tennis coaches in the state. Both the GICC boys and girls tennis teams have excelled under Lowry's leadership, with the girls team accumulating two state championships, five runner-up finishes, four third place finishes and three fourth place finishes. The boys teams have had two third and fourth place finishes, and three fifth place finishes. Additionally, Lowry has coached nine doubles state champions and three state singles champions. James teaches social studies here at Central Catholic. Congratulations!

In addition, the 1989 Hastings College men's basketball team was

inducted into the Hastings College Athletic Hall of Fame. The team completed a 26-9 record, qualified for the NAIA National Tournament, and made it to the Elite 8 for the first time in school history. Members include James Lowry '91/'94 MAT and Bill Gavers'88 helped coach the team. Gavers currently serves as the Central Catholic Athletic Director, after 24 years of teaching and coaching at GICC.
