# CRUSADERS FOR LIFE CLUB

Grand Island Central Catholic (GICC) has a new club, Crusaders for Life, that offers students a way to unite the student body with the common goal to preserve pro-life values.

"We think it's important to teach people pro-life values and what it means to be pro-life," said co-president Gabe Wemhoff.

GICC Principal Jordan Engle, teacher Dee Hanssen, Michael Kube, and GICC parent, Ann Rief, along with Hayden Price and Gabe Wemhoff, seniors at GICC, started the club at the end of last school year to allow students to share their voices and gain more insight into pro-life issues.

"We want to do more than just change Central Catholic to pro-life but also the community. Once you change the community, you can change the state; once you change the state, things can really snowball from there to hopefully end abortion," shared Wemhoff.

Pro-life Director for the Diocese of Grand Island, Michael Kube, has worked in conjunction with Students for Life to begin developing pro-life clubs throughout the Catholic schools in the Grand Island Diocese. Kube's goals include getting speakers to schools, spreading the pro-life message, and attending the March for Life in Washington



D.C. Ultimately, Kube sees the importance of reaching younger generations.

"I think it's important that the younger generation take on this pro-life movement for future generations. It's so important that they understand the facts and the logic and the reasons why it is so important to be pro-life," added Kube.

Crusaders for Life was involved in Shoot4Life at the Heartland Shooting Park in September. Once Crusaders for Life is fully operational, there will be monthly meetings and special events for members to learn more about pro-life matters. Goals are established for this year by the founding leaders.

"We have future goals... one of them is to try to encourage high schoolers to attend the national pro-life march in D.C... We are working on a scholarship that supports sending students to D.C this year." concluded Mike.

# GONE BUT NOT FORGOTTEN BY CATHY HOWARD

## BARB MEYER

Barb Meyer, much loved and long time former business teacher at Grand Island Central Catholic, died November 13, 2020, from cancer after a long illness. Her devoted husband, Jerry, cared for her at home. Mrs. Meyer fought her disease valiantly for several years, and GICC friends always recall her courage and positive attitude. Even during her chemo treatments, she never missed her grandchildren's activities and remained a passionate Husker fan.

Mrs. Meyer joined the Central Catholic staff in 1979. Students remember her diligent preparation, her beautiful and welcoming smile, and her wonderful laugh. "Between Mrs. Meyer and Mrs. Ley, I had the absolutely best business teachers in high school," said 1980 graduate and current GICC business teacher Colleen Chapman Childers. "Mrs. Meyer was such a great role model as a business teacher, and it's because of her and Mrs. Ley that I became a business teacher."

Barb was extremely proud of her grandson, Kellon Meyer, a talented kicker for the Ord football team who picked up a walk-on offer from Nebraska, only the second known walk-on in the Huskers 2021 class. Even as she was ill, Barb traveled to Kellon's games. Wrapped up in a warm coat, she watched from the car to cheer on her beloved grandson. Kellon's team defeated Fremont Bergan to win the 2020 Class C-2 state championship. Barb died only a week before the championship game. "She watched from the best seat in the house," GICC friend and volleyball coach Sharon Zavala said.

She was proud of all her grandchildren and firmly believed they were the most wonderful people in the world - next to her own sons, Doug and Brian.

## FRAN BRANDON

Fran Brandon, lover of family, friends, cross stitch and very bad photoshopping, died on September 23, 2020. After a brief time in a Detroit convent, Fran met the love of her life, Hugh Brandon. Any lingering ideas of the sisterhood or convent living were effectively banished.

The couple were first employed at Chadron Assumption High School. Hugh made exactly one dollar more than Fran since he was the head of the family. Their oldest child, Mike, was born in Chadron. Hugh was hired as a teacher and coach at Hay Springs, NE, in 1972, and Fran gave birth to three more children before the family moved to Grand Island.

Hugh was the superintendent/principal at Grand Island Central Catholic for 12 years, and Fran taught at Westlawn Elementary for 15 years. Eventually she retired and started a daycare in her home to bond with many adoring and noisy toddlers while Hugh hid out in the basement.

In 2008, the couple moved to Gretna to be closer to their children. Fran continued her daycare operation until she was diagnosed with cancer in 2016. Hugh cared for her at home for four years until she was admitted to the Hospice House. Fran died surrounded by her family.

She loved sewing, crosswords, genealogy, and The Golden Girls. Her terrible photoshopping technique has been a legendary family story ever since Fran meticulously tried to correct a family photo included in her yearly Christmas card which she never got around to sending out until the following March. When the photo revealed Hugh and her son Mike's eyes shut, Fran attempted to draw in realistic looking eyeballs with a black magic marker. "Nobody will notice," she said. Everybody noticed.

Fran is survived by Hugh, her four children, Mike, Kelly, Erin and Sean - all graduates of Central Catholic - and their families.
